










Wisconsin Gymnastics Clubs Program Standards

Our Mission is to help protect athletes, employees, and businesses by creating a universal guide to help prevent the spread of disease during the initial phases of re-opening our facilities

These guidelines are developed with the intention of establishing operating procedures and standards for all Gymnastics Clubs within Wisconsin. Business ownership stands united behind these policies in agreement that maintaining such regulations will provide the safest operation possible. These policies will evolve as the threat to the safety of our clients and staff is reduced.

	Entrance	Students and Families will be allowed entrance to the building through a supervised entrance point, and entries will be controlled to avoid a congestion point.
	Classes	A staff member will assist students to their classes maintaining a 6-foot distance. Families are limited to one parent per child, and should they stay to observe the class they will be asked to observe a 6-foot distance between them and other adults.
	Hand Sanitizing	Each staff and student will be directed to wash hands and/or sanitize (using a disinfectant sanitizer) before and after class or as needed during the class period.
	Temperature	It is encouraged that parents take a temperature reading for the child prior to attending. Children with elevated temperatures are required to stay home. Make up classes will be offered for such absence.
	Staff	PPE may be in order if the instructor infringes on a children's 6-foot distance requirement. Coaches are instructed to use verbal cues to teach and rely upon hand spotting only minimally.
	Equipment	Staff are required to sanitize all contact surfaces before and after each class's use. Cleaning supplies and hand sanitizer will be located throughout the activity area, and coaches are encouraged to utilize them as needed.
	Facility Ratio	Club management is to uphold the student to square foot ratio or 30% based on fire code standards, considering the building capacity and account for staff and audience present.
	Schedule	Gym Managers will be responsible for scheduling classes in consideration of class ratio, facility allowance, and space needed through access points. Classes will be time-spaced appropriately to allow families to enter/exit with minimal overlap.
	Spacing	During instruction, students are required to maintain a 6-foot distance between themselves and others. Tape or floor markers will be provided for establishing safe distancing.
	Common Areas	Staff will be required to sanitize all common area surfaces between classes, and thoroughly at the close of day's business. Any sold food and drink may be restricted and or available only on a limited basis.

	<p>Health Standard</p>	<p>All staff members are to agree to adhere to a 24-hour wellness standard. Should they feel fatigued or feverish within 24 hours of a shift, they are required to call off the assigned shift. Staff temperatures will be taken prior to teaching daily.</p>
	<p>Disinfecting</p>	<p>CDC/EPA compliant disinfectant and virucide will be used on all hard surfaces. Material safe cleaners will be used on all soft surfaces and equipment. Disinfecting should be done at a minimum of once per day.</p>
	<p>Water</p>	<p>Water fountains will be used only with cups provided for individual use. If the drinking fountain is restricted, an alternative source for water will be provided</p>
	<p>Chalk</p>	<p>Athletes use of hand chalk and spray bottles (used on uneven bars) will be as individual supply. Each athlete will have a personal supply that only they will use. No shared chalk should be used in the gym.</p>
	<p>Class Length</p>	<p>Modified training schedules may be provided to accommodate facility capacity and student to teacher ratios.</p>
	<p>Ventilation</p>	<p>Facilities will always maintain an operational ventilation system and/or provide access to fresh air.</p>
	<p>Exit</p>	<p>Staff will assist students and families to exit using floor markers and directional pathways. Facilities using the same doorway for entrance and exit will sanitize the area minimally once per hour.</p>
